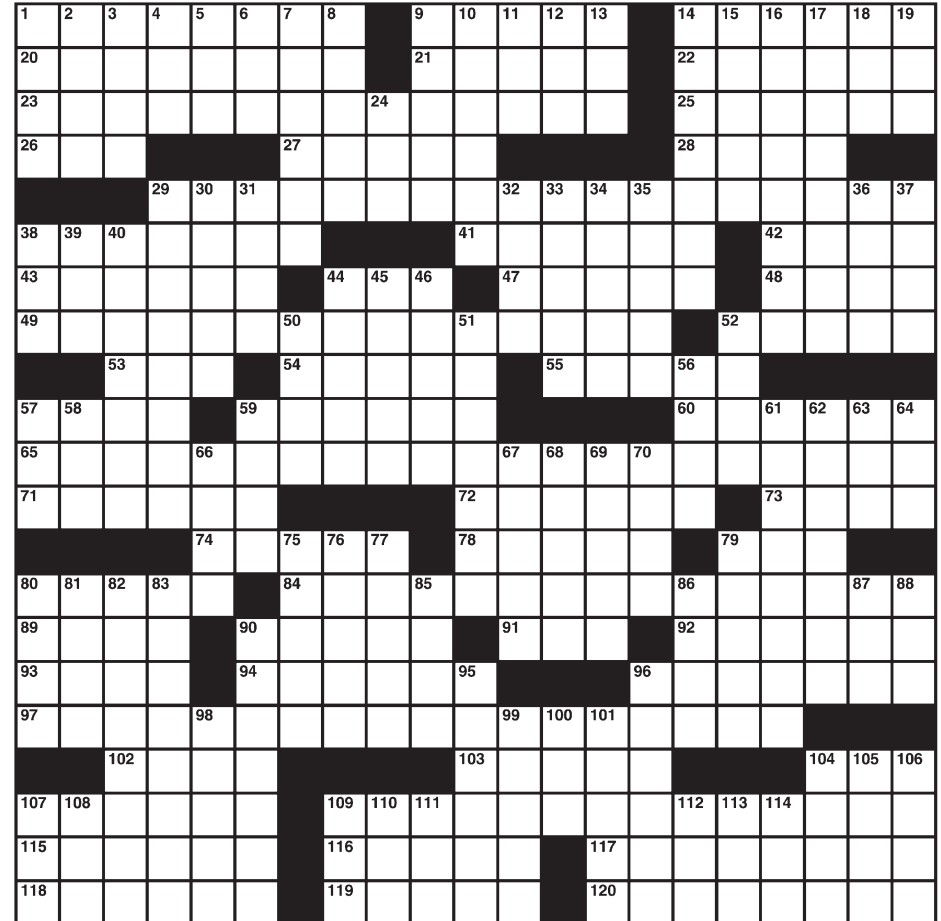

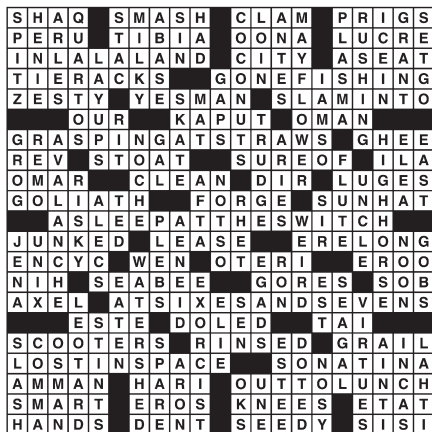
Last Week's Cryptograms

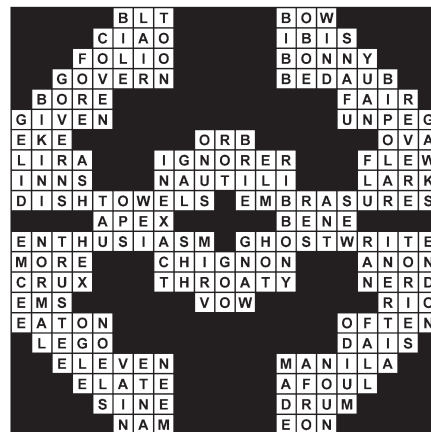
